# Puente is 20: finding power in community

One key to Puente's growth has been its responsiveness to the needs of its communities—to be nimble and guided by the people who rely on its services. That strategy has yielded powerful results as participants not only ask for programs but have been stepping up to help run them.

Residents provide the engine that powers those efforts, and more. The result is a cohort of locals who may not have been born in the U.S., but who feel like they belong, as well as those who have lived on the South Coast for decades.

Puente continues to provide extensive health services for insured and uninsured residents including enrollment for health coverage, case management for participants with chronic illnesses, transportation and interpretation for medical appointments, dental screenings, cleanings and extractions at mobile clinics in Pescadero, vaccines and immunizations, and weekly medical appointments through the Coastside Medical Clinic based at Puente. Puente has increased preventive services through fitness classes like Zumba and exercise for adults 55+, ballet folklórico for children and adults, and soccer tournaments for farmworkers. We also offer healthy cooking, nutrition and women's health classes.

While demand for these services has increased due to stress and uncertainty since 2016, changed County priorities have led to reduced funding and greater stress on Puente as we work to fill the funding gaps.

# Puente tiene 20 años: encontrando poder en la comunidad

Una de las claves para el crecimiento de Puente ha sido su capacidad de respuesta a las necesidades de sus comunidades: actuar con prontitud y con la guía de las personas que dependen de sus servicios. Esta estrategia ha arrojado resultados poderosos ya que los participantes no solo piden programas, sino que también ayudan a ejecutarlos.

Los residentes proporcionan el motor que impulsa todos esos esfuerzos, y más. El resultado es un grupo de gente local que pueden no haber nacido en los Estados Unidos, pero que sienten que pertenecen a esta comunidad al igual que aquellos que han vivido en la Costa Sur por décadas.

Puente continúa brindando amplios servicios de salud para residentes asegurados y no asegurados, incluyendo la inscripción para cobertura médica, coordinación de casos para participantes con enfermedades crónicas, transporte e interpretación para citas médicas, exámenes dentales, limpiezas y extracciones en clínicas móviles en Pescadero, vacunas e inmunizaciones, y semanalmente, citas médicas a través de la Clínica Médica Coastsde con sede en Puente. Puente ha aumentado sus servicios preventivos a través de clases de acondicionamiento físico como Zumba y ejercicios para adultos mayores de 55 años, ballet folklórico para niños y adultos y torneos de fútbol para trabajadores agrícolas. También ofrecemos clases de cocina saludable, nutrición y de temas de salud para mujeres.

El equipo de salud mental de Puente apoya el empoderamiento a través de la terapia individual, los grupos de apoyo y la intervención en crisis,

especialmente en torno a la violencia doméstica. Si bien la demanda de estos servicios ha aumentado, el cambio de las prioridades del Condado ha llevado a la reducción de apoyo financiero y mayor estrés en Puente a medida que trabajamos para llenar la falta de fondos requeridos para este programa.

# Students immerse themselves in ECE classes on the South Coast



Puente has long dreamed of bringing ECE [early childhood education] classes to the South Coast so that community members could learn how best to support the healthy development of all children in the community. In fall 2017, that vision became a reality.

A certificate program offered by Cañada College at Puente creates a way for adult students to obtain a California Child

Development Assistant permit. With an emphasis on the importance of nurturing the “whole child,” students in the program develop the skills, beliefs and attitudes to prepare children for future school success. Students receive financial and academic support to succeed in the ECE courses, taught in Spanish, as well as help to facilitate their educational goals like certificate programs, transfer to a Bachelor degree program, and career advancement.

Obtaining the Child Development Assistant permit will take two years, as

students take one Early Childhood Education course per semester, along with an accompanying English as a Second Language (ESL) course, also offered at Puente.

The program’s schedule is tailored to support the adult—mostly women—students in their academic journey as well as enable them to continue with their full-time employment and demanding home lives.

# Estudiantes se sumergen en clases de ECE en la Costa Sur



Puente ha soñado durante mucho tiempo con traer clases de educación para la primera infancia (ECE) a la Costa Sur para que los miembros de la comunidad puedan aprender la mejor manera de apoyar el desarrollo saludable de todos los niños en la comunidad. En el otoño de 2017, esa visión se hizo realidad. Un programa de certificación ofrecido por Cañada College en Puente crea una manera para que los estudiantes

adultos obtengan un permiso de Asistente de Desarrollo Infantil otorgado por el Estado de California. Con un énfasis en la importancia de criar al "niño completo," los estudiantes en el programa desarrollan las habilidades, creencias y actitudes de enseñanza para preparar a los niños para el futuro éxito escolar. Los estudiantes reciben apoyo financiero y académico para tener éxito en los cursos de ECE que se imparten en español, así como también para ayudarles con a facilitar sus objetivos educativos como certificado, transferencia a un programa de licenciatura y avance profesional.

Obtener el permiso de Asistente de Desarrollo Infantil tomará dos años, ya que los estudiantes toman un

curso de Educación de la Primera Infancia por semestre, junto con un curso de inglés como Segundo Idioma (ESL) que también se ofrece en Puente. El horario del programa se adapta para apoyar a los estudiantes adultos—en su mayoría mujeres—en su camino académico, así como para permitirles continuar con su empleo de tiempo completo y exigencias del hogar.

# Puente continues to meet immigration challenges

The President's "zero tolerance" policy has left residents of our community feeling unsafe, vulnerable and living in constant fear. Recent events like the forced separation of children from their parents, and immigration sweeps throughout Northern California have added to the fear and uncertainty, traumatizing adults and children in our community.

Local residents can become victims if they do not know their rights.

Puente bridges the knowledge gap for undocumented immigrants through regular "Know Your Rights" workshops, immigration representation through the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) representatives and immigration attorneys, and tools for self-advocacy. Puente's behavioral health team addresses fear and trauma caused by the political climate and administration policies.

Puente's Community Resource Navigator, Laura Rodriguez, is Puente's newest staff member accredited by the U.S. Board of

Immigration Appeals. She goes directly to farmworkers in the field during lunch or break times to answer questions and screen them for immigration benefits including U.S. Citizenship, Adjustment of Status, U-Visas, DACA renewals, and other administrative services such as renewal of a green card, certificate of citizenship and more. Puente's *Promotoras Comunitarias* bring "Know Your Rights" workshops to workplaces and community events.

Puente worked to increase legal and immigration services for deportation relief, U-Visas and Violence Against Women (VAWA) process by advocating with local allies for funding to San Mateo County for a new Coastsides immigration collaborative in partnership with University of San Francisco, Ayudando Latinos A Soñar (ALAS) and Coastsides Hope.



# Puente sigue enfrentando retos de inmigración

La política de "tolerancia cero" del Presidente ha dejado a los residentes de nuestra comunidad sintiéndose inseguros, vulnerables y viviendo en constante temor. Los recientes eventos, como la separación forzada de los niños de sus padres, y las redadas de inmigración en todo el norte de California han aumentado el temor y la incertidumbre, traumatizando a adultos y niños en nuestra comunidad. Los residentes locales pueden convertirse en víctimas si no conocen sus derechos.

Puente provee información para los inmigrantes indocumentados a través de talleres regulares de "Conozca sus Derechos," representación de inmigración a través de representantes de la Junta de Apelaciones de Inmigración (BIA), abogados de inmigración, y herramientas para la autogestión. Es importante destacar que el equipo de salud de comportamiento y recuperación de Puente continuará abordando el miedo y los traumas causados por el clima político y las políticas de esta administración.

# Puente partnerships move women's health and dental services to center stage



Many women living in and around the South Coast contend with impediments to access to care, language barriers, and general lack of health education. Many do not have easy access to a car to get to appointments, let alone a health care provider who speaks Spanish.

Thanks to a co-initiative with the San Mateo County Health System, Puente is now offering a women's clinic on the last

Wednesday of the month. Marissa Pfohl, a nurse practitioner who speaks Spanish and serves on the San Mateo County Street and Field Medicine Team, is in charge. In-house clinic services include basic pelvic exams, breast exams, STD screening, pre-conception counseling, pap smears, mammogram referrals, and most forms of contraception.

Puente also ramped up its children's dental services, thanks to a partnership with the Ravenswood Family Health Center. Ravenswood sets up a mobile dental clinic in a Puente classroom for a day. They bring a child-sized dental chair and other essential equipment, along with some toys.

"Knowing that dental caries are largely preventable and simple changes in a family's lifestyle can help keep the children's teeth healthy is essential for any community. But it's especially essential in Pescadero, given how isolated it is, and the fact that getting children to and from their dental appointments can be time consuming, expensive and almost prohibitive for some," says Yogita Butani Thakur, Chief Dental Officer for the Ravenswood Family Health Center.

# Colaboraciones de Puente dan prioridad a servicios de salud de la mujer y dentales



Muchas mujeres que viven en la Costa Sur y sus alrededores deben lidiar con barreras para acceder atención médica, como el idioma y la falta de educación para la salud en general. Muchas no tienen acceso fácil a un automóvil para llegar a sus citas, y mucho menos a un proveedor de atención médica que hable español.

Gracias a una co-iniciativa con el Sistema de Salud del Condado de

San Mateo, Puente ahora está ofreciendo una clínica para mujeres el último miércoles del mes. Marissa Pfohl, una enfermera practicante que habla español y es miembro del Equipo de Medicina de Campo y de la Calle del Condado de San Mateo, es la encargada.

Los servicios clínicos internos incluyen exámenes pélvicos básicos, exámenes de los senos, pruebas de

detección de enfermedades de transmisión sexual, asesoramiento previo a la concepción, pruebas de Papanicolaou, mamografías y la mayoría de las formas de anticonceptivos.

Puente también incrementó los servicios dentales para niños, gracias a una colaboración con el Centro de Salud Familiar Ravenswood.

Ravenswood establece una clínica dental móvil en un aula de Puente por un día. Su equipo trae una silla dental para niños y otros equipos esenciales, junto con algunos juguetes.

"Saber que las caries dentales se pueden prevenir en gran medida y que los cambios simples en el estilo de vida de una familia pueden ayudar a mantener saludables los dientes de los niños, es esencial para cualquier comunidad. Pero es especialmente esencial en Pescadero, dado lo aislado que es, y el hecho de que llevar a los niños a sus citas dentales puede gastar mucho tiempo, ser costoso y casi prohibitivo para algunos," dice Yogita Butani Thakur, Directora Dental de la Familia Ravenswood Centro de Salud.

# Food and community at La Sala (The Living Room)

Puente is built on the foundation of radical hospitality (practice of putting extraordinary effort and emphasis on making people feel welcome), and receiving strangers with open arms as brothers and sisters. This founding principle is perhaps most present in La Sala, Puente's oldest program, where a newcomer can find a home-cooked meal and pleasant company twice a week. Most of the weekly participants are farmworkers on the South Coast, who are on their own here, without families. Many of the men who participate in La Sala have been living in Pescadero and the surrounding communities for several years. There are some newcomers, who are still acclimating to the community.

The men come to the social hall of the Pescadero Community Church for a homemade meal and an essential dose of camaraderie that helps alleviate

some of their intense isolation that comes from being so far from home. The single men who work in the fields and nurseries around Pescadero have always been able to count on La Sala, from the earliest days when the mission was defined as a ministry of bicycles, blankets and beans.

Puente remains committed to "welcoming the stranger," and creating a sense of "home" for everyone on the South Coast.

# Comida y comunidad en La Sala

Puente se fundó con base en la hospitalidad radical (práctica de poner un esfuerzo extraordinario y énfasis en hacer que las personas se sientan bienvenidas), y recibir a extraños con los brazos abiertos como hermanos y hermanas. Este principio fundamental tal vez esté más presente en La Sala de Puente, su programa más antiguo. La Sala es donde un recién llegado puede encontrar una comida casera y una compañía agradable dos veces por semana. La mayoría de los participantes semanales son trabajadores agrícolas en la Costa Sur, que están solos aquí, sin familias. Muchos de los hombres que participan en La Sala han estado viviendo en Pescadero y en las comunidades aledañas durante varios años. Hay algunos recién llegados, que todavía se están aclimatando a la nueva comunidad.

Los hombres acuden al salón social de la Iglesia Comunitaria de Pescadero para compartir una comida casera y una dosis esencial

de camaradería que ayuda a aliviar parte de su intenso aislamiento que proviene de estar tan lejos de casa. Los hombres solteros que trabajan en los campos y viveros alrededor de Pescadero siempre han podido contar con La Sala, desde los primeros días en que su misión se definió como un ministerio de bicicletas, cobijas y frijoles.

Puente mantiene su compromiso de "dar la bienvenida al extraño" y crear un sentido de "hogar" para todos en la Costa Sur. Este es un principio que se siente olvidado, o al menos amenazado en el clima político actual; afortunadamente la hospitalidad radical está prosperando en la Costa Sur.



# Sidelined from Silicon Valley's affluence, South Coast residents seek emergency rental assistance



Most people agree that it's been a good year for the American economy, which has the lowest unemployment rate since 2002

However, in Pescadero, La Honda, San Gregorio, Loma Mar and other small communities on the South Coast, low-income residents are persevering through the most frightening period of

economic uncertainty they have ever seen. That's because the economic boom has translated into record housing scarcity in their communities.

When a trailer or apartment does become available, the rent is often so high that even dual-income families struggle to pay it, along with utilities, groceries, gas, and a myriad of other expenses.

In the past year, Puente has seen many requests for emergency assistance with rent and utility bills. Puente acts quickly to help meet financial gaps with County and federal funds as well as its own general funds.

Just this year, one family – 2 parents and 3 school-aged children – endured nearly a year of homelessness after being evicted from their Pescadero apartment when renovations needed to be done.

Nearly anywhere outside the Bay Area, a working family would have been able to find somewhere else to live. Instead, they laid their heads where they could... in their car, on the floor of a friend's one-room home to keep their kids in school and some semblance of normalcy in their lives. The family searched for months for a vacant home. Eventually they found one. Puente then provided assistance for the rental deposit and first month's rent.

# Marginados a la riqueza de Silicon Valley, los residentes de la Costa Sur buscan asistencia de emergencia para alquiler



La mayoría de las personas están de acuerdo en que ha sido un buen año para la economía estadounidense, que tiene la tasa de desempleo más baja desde el 2002.

Sin embargo, en Pescadero, La Honda, San Gregorio, Loma Mar y otras pequeñas comunidades en la Costa Sur, los residentes de bajos ingresos persisten en el período de

incertidumbre económica más alarmante que jamás hayan visto. Esto se debe a que el auge económico se ha traducido en una escasez récord de viviendas en sus comunidades.

Cuando un remolque o apartamento está disponible, el alquiler es a menudo tan alto que incluso las familias con doble ingreso tienen dificultades para pagarlo, junto con los servicios públicos, comestibles, gas y una gran cantidad de otros gastos.

Apenas este año, una familia, 2 padres y 3 niños en edad escolar, sufrieron casi un año de falta de hogar después de ser desalojados de su apartamento en Pescadero cuando era necesario realizar renovaciones.

Casi en cualquier lugar fuera del Área de la Bahía, una familia trabajadora como esta hubiera podido encontrar otro lugar para vivir. En cambio, ellos pusieron sus cabezas donde podían ... en su auto, en el piso de la casa de una habitación de un amigo para mantener a sus hijos en la escuela y algo de normalidad en sus vidas.

Después de meses de búsqueda, la familia encontró un lugar y Puente proporcionó asistencia para el depósito y el primer mes de alquiler.

# High school graduate brings self-knowledge to college

Jacqueline Martinez, 18, is attending New York University, likely the first-ever student at Pescadero High to have enrolled at NYU. She lives in a dorm with strangers, and goes to class in a city where she didn't know a soul at the beginning of the semester.

Life changed for Martinez the first summer she enrolled in the Puente Youth Program as a high school freshman. Puente took her group on educational field trips to destinations like San

Francisco's Mission District and to visit Google headquarters. "I found myself fascinated by the different people and cultures I saw." That was her first 'aha' moment, but it led to many others. "Those experiences are what nudged me to challenge myself more and take the initiative to do more, to find a way to take more steps out of my town," she says.

Martinez got to know her high school social studies teacher, Mr. Robinson. He arranged for Martinez to apply for a fellowship from the Half Moon Bay Order of Odd Fellows to attend the United Nations Pilgrimage for Youth.

# Graduada de la preparatoria trae autoconocimiento a la Universidad

Jacqueline Martínez, de 18 años, asiste a la Universidad de Nueva York. Es probable que ella sea la primera estudiante de la Preparatoria de Pescadero inscrita en esta universidad. Ella vive en un dormitorio con extraños y asiste a las clases en una ciudad donde no conocía a nadie al comienzo del semestre.

La vida cambió para Martínez el primer verano en que se inscribió en el Programa Juvenil de Puente como estudiante de primer año de preparatoria. Puente llevó al grupo a excursiones educativas como el Distrito de la Misión de San Francisco y la sede de Google. "Me fascinaron las diferentes personas y culturas que vi. Ese fue su primer momento de descubrimiento, pero hubo muchos otros. Esas experiencias son lo que me impulsaron a desafiar más y a tomar la iniciativa para hacer más, para encontrar una manera de dar más pasos fuera de mi ciudad", dice ella.

Martínez conoció a su maestro de estudios sociales en la escuela secundaria, el Sr. Robinson, quien hizo los arreglos para que Martínez solicitara una beca de la Orden de Odd Fellows de Half Moon Bay para asistir a la Peregrinación de La Juventud en las Naciones Unidas.

Martínez recibió una beca completa para visitar la sede de las Naciones Unidas en Nueva York, junto con cientos de otros estudiantes de todo

el mundo. En ese viaje fue cuando tuvo un segundo descubrimiento. Se dio cuenta de que le gustaba Nueva York.

En su graduación de preparatoria, Martínez recibió un reconocimiento especial como Salutatorian por haber obtenido el segundo lugar en promedio de calificaciones. También recibió el Diploma del Sello de Mérito Golden State. Antes de irse a la universidad, un donante de Puente le otorgó a Martínez una beca de \$ 5,000 dólares.

En el último año, Puente aprovechó \$88,000 en becas para estudiantes universitarios locales.

# La Honda Office continues to meet the needs of region



Puente launched its Exercise for Adults 55+ class in May and has been looking to expand its programming for older adults on the South Coast. The class is free, and consistently well attended. Despite its name, the class welcomes adults of any age.

The class owes its reputation to instructor Lynnette Vega, a friend and neighbor to many, who has lived in the La Honda community for about 50 years. She is an art therapist and facilitator who teaches exercises in relaxation and stress reduction at Foothill College and helps manage a variety of senior programs in Los Gatos. Vega also helps run the La Honda chapter of Indivisible, a grassroots national movement.

La Honda may be isolated, but its residents know how to advocate for themselves and get their needs met. For instance, a small,

invitation-only, group of seniors helps each other out when someone needs it, as there are no senior-serving facilities in or near La Honda. Whether it's transportation, help around the house, or physical therapy, the neighbors are there.

# La oficina de La Honda continúa satisfaciendo las necesidades de la región



Puente lanzó su clase Ejercicio para Adultos 55+ en mayo y ha estado buscando expandir su programación para adultos mayores en la Costa Sur. La clase es gratuita y siempre bien atendida. A pesar de su nombre, la clase permite adultos de cualquier edad.

La clase debe su reputación a la instructora Lynnette Vega, una amiga y vecina de

muchas personas, que ha vivido en la comunidad de La Honda durante aproximadamente 50 años. Ella es terapeuta artística y facilitadora que enseña ejercicios de relajación y reducción del estrés en Foothill College y ayuda a administrar una variedad de programas para personas de la tercera edad en Los Gatos. Vega también ayuda a dirigir el capítulo de La Honda Indivisible, un movimiento nacional.

La Honda puede estar aislada, pero sus residentes saben cómo defenderse y satisfacer sus necesidades.


